

### A RARE PIECE OF CANADIAN PLASTICVILLE ADVERTISING

recent email from a non-collector in Canada provided me with a scan of the Plasticville catalog illustrated with this text. It is of the 1953 Canadian Plasticville catalog published by Frank Martin Co. Ltd. of Toronto, Ontario, Canada. The front page of this piece states that it is a catalog but in actuality it is closer to a brochure.

The piece is 11 inches high  $\times$  22½ inches wide when folded open. There is a vertical fold line that is 8½ inches in from the right hand side when viewing the "catalog" side of the sheet. There is also a vertical fold line that is 4¼ inches in from the left side. Both of these folds would be folded away from the viewer to create an  $8½ \times 11$  catalog/brochure. One thing of note is that the cover stated Plasticville, not Plasticville USA. That is also typical of all Canadian Plasticville boxes.


A comparison of the prices listed and those of the Plasticville USA catalog are a bit interesting. Many of the

prices are identical such as the barn, gas station, and police station, as well as the accessories offered. The school house was lower whereas the diner was higher in price. All prices were within a few cents. That probably makes sense since the exchange rate was between \$1.02 and \$1.06 to the American dollar at that time.

This is the first piece of Canadian advertising that I have seen in over 22 years of collecting. The scans will be added to the Plasticville Collectors Association in the near future.



### #K-122 Fuel Station

opyrighted in 1993, the K-Line Diesel Fueling Station was a good replacement for the original Marx version which had begun to get scarce and pricey, often times only available without a box or tattered box, or worse yet – broken! The K-Line version differed from the original Marx by having a darker brown base, a white shack vs. the brown of the original, and blue figures vs. the silver of the original. This accessory is as relevant now


as it was when Marx originally introduced it circa 1958. The figures are decently scaled for Ogauge and anyone who runs Marx F-7 diesels, or Lionel F-3's or any of the modern remakes of older style engines can certainly use this in their servicing yard. It measures 107/8"L × 23/4"W × 51/2"H, is illuminated, and has a



moving man on the platform as well as the shack - both activated by a control button. The two fuel pumps swivel and each have a flexible refueling hose with a control house in the center of the platform. The control button was a totally new design by K-Line as they never re-utilized any of the older style Marx controls.

### OPERATION OF THE STATION

To simulate actual railroad operation, a diesel locomotive is brought alongside of the statio and brought to a stop. When the controller button is pressed, the attendant with the hos approaches the track to fuel the engine, while the other man moves around to the othe side of the shanty. When the button is released, the men move back to their origina positions.

To prevent overheating of the coil, do not hold down the controller button for longer than to 10 seconds.

### K-LINE LAMPPOSTS

### DONALD W. HUOVINEN

"NEW IN 1983", "LIGHTED ACCESSORIES", "These K-Line Accessories are new in 1983 – they are authentic looking reproductions of old time fixtures: a perfect addition to any layout".

Thus was K-Line's hype for their new lighted accessories. This article will focus on three of those lighted accessories, and their variations, introduced in that year. Interestingly the identical claim was made in the 1984 catalog, i.e. "These K-Line Accessories are new in 1984 – they are authentic looking reproductions of old time fixtures: a perfect addition to any layout".

Two of these accessories were among the longest running in the K-Line catalogs, being cataloged from 1983 through 2000.

The photo below shows the different types of lampposts discussed in this article: K105 Lampposts, K-106 Lampposts With Firebox, Police Callbox and Mail Box, and K-109 Twin Lampposts.



### K-105 Lampposts

These lampposts were issued as a set of three and were similar to the Marx #074 Lamp Post from which they were derived. The lampposts were cataloged from 1983 through 2000. The lampposts were black. The lampposts were wrapped in tissue paper and came packaged in a Type 13 or 14 box. The box and contents are shown in Photo 2. There was one Instruction Sheet which was common for all three types of lampposts. The Instruction Sheets were not consistently included in the boxes.

The K-1103 Little Girls Classic Train set, available from 1991 to 1996, included 3 pastel blue lampposts. The lampposts were otherwise identical to the regular lampposts.

K-Line's second girl's set, the K-1123S (with Railsounds) or K-1123W (with air whistle) cataloged only in 2002, included 5 pink lampposts. These lampposts were also otherwise identical to the regular lampposts.

In 1986 K-Line first cataloged the K-



105X Lampposts with Lockon. These were identical to the K-105 Lampposts but now included 3 lockons. They were last cataloged in 1996. Marx also marketed lampposts which included lockons for use with trains that operated with transformers having only two binding posts.

# K-106 Lamppost With Firebox, Police Call Box, and Mail Box

These lampposts were cataloged from 1983 through 1996 and were similar to the Marx #073/3 Lighted Boulevard Lamp Post Set. As such these lampposts were identical to the K-105 lamppost with an "attached box to add interest to your layout". The attached boxes were red (Fire), white (Police) and blue (Mail). The lampposts were wrapped in tissue paper and were packaged in a Type 13 or 14 box. In



the early issues of the sets the three boxes were furnished separately and had to be attached to the lampposts by the purchaser. Later issues came with the boxes already attached to the lampposts. Photo 3 shows the box and contents. Photo 4 shows the individual boxes which were to be attached to the lampposts. Photo 5


is the instruction sheet with instructions for gluing the

boxes to the lampposts. As previously stated, this same instruction sheet was used for all three of the lampposts.



### K-109 Twin Lampposts

These "turn of the century classic" lampposts were similar to the Marx #078 Twin Lamp Post. They were cataloged from 1983 through 2000. Two lampposts were included.





The lampposts were green. The lampposts were wrapped in tissue paper and were packaged in a Type 13 or 14 box. The bulbs for the lampposts, which were clear round bulbs, were wrapped separately in tissue paper and in turn packed into small cardboard boxes, two bulbs per box. The contents of the packaged lampposts are shown in Photo 6.



### A PLASTICVILLE PUZZLE

ere we have a Plasticville themed puzzle manufactured by Tuco. Not a lot of information is known about this product. According to some online research, Tuco Work Shops Inc. was based in Lockport NY, and operated from 1932 to 1984. They made die-cut cardboard puzzles. You can find several Tuco puzzles on online auction sites, but the Plasticville version appears hard to find. An interesting note, which makes the puzzle harder to complete, is that the cover shows

only a fraction of the puzzle. You can see three children's faces centered on the box.



When you assemble the puzzle you find that there are actually 10 children and the policeman. The large gas station, light blue-roofed cape cod, yellow roofed frosty bar, and the turnpike interchange are featured in the puzzle. There are also several accessories including cars, a bus, citizens, a Solarex billboard, and a flag pole. Some small miscellaneous items like fireboxes and street name signs are also shown. It appears that the Police officer is using the Plasticville set up to teach the children about safety. There is no sign of any railroad-themed items in the graphic.

The puzzle is part of the "Advanced Children's Series" and is numbered 2050. It contains 100 large pieces, the box advertises them as "WOOD-LIKE Fibre Board".

### BACK IN THE BOX / A CONTINUING SERIES ON REPACKING PLASTICVILLE

### BN-1 Type Barn

### JOHN L. NIEHAUS

ne of the biggest issues I have with storing Plasticville pieces is getting them back into the box in which they were packed so that the box closes completely. That not only means that I can close the box but that there are no pieces sticking up to bulge the lid or prevent it from closing completely. I have spent considerable time with some pieces. The BN-1 type barn seems to be one of the major problems when getting it back into the box. The photos with this article is my step by step process to get it "back in the box".

Place the box in front of you with it open and the top folded away from you.

Photo 1: Place the roof sections into the box on top of each other with their undersides showing and their pointed ends opposite each other.



Photo 2: Slide the sections to the back of the box.



Photo 3: Lay the side wall with the sliding doors right side up in on top of the roof sections.



Photo 4: Lay the side with the Dutch door right side up in on top of the previous piece resting its bottom edge on the upper edge of the previous pieces' threshold.





Photo 5: Lay the end walls in with the wall with the silo mounting section face down and the double door end wall face up. Push both to the back of the box as par as possible.



Photo 6: Install the cap on the silo and place it in the open area in the front of the box with its mounting extension down. Place the ventilators and weathervane in the remaining space in the front of the box.



Hint: An easy way to keep from losing the ventilators and weathervane is to wrap them in a tissue paper and then insert them into the bottom of the silo.






### **PRODUCT REVIEWS**

JOHN L. NIEHAUS

Bill Nole's Classic Guide to Vintage "O" Plasticville, Bill Nole, 202 pages, softcover, 8½ × 8½ format, \$29.95. This is the first Plasticville guide published since before the great recession. It is an updated version of that previous guide. As with the previous edition this edition also includes Storytown, Make 'N' Play, and Lionel Plasticville. This edition has both a dedication and a foreword whereas the previous edition did not have a foreword. Sandwiched between these is a table of contents, again, something not in the previous edition. The foreword contains information on uncatalogued items such as the LCCA and TCA special edition pieces. It also touches quite well on grading. I would call it recommended reading especially if you are new to collecting Plasticville.

The format of each chapter is the same as in the previous edition in that all of the pieces in the chapter are discussed and them followed by a listing of each piece previously discussed, an inclusive listing of the piece's part/stock number, the color variations, and the value as of the guide's printing. I say "value as of the guide's printing" as the vast majority of values are considerably lower than in

the previous edition. For example; the 1907 Apartment House is valued in Like New Boxed condition at \$25 as opposed to \$90 in the previous edition. The factory is now valued at \$35 as opposed to \$95 in Like New Boxed condition in the previous edition. It is my sentiment that



these prices are pretty much in line with what I have been able to sell them for at train shows in the Midwest.

This guide is a welcome update to the previous edition and should be your go to publication for current Plasticville values.

Bill Nole's Classic Guide to Vintage "O" Plasticville, can be purchased directly from the publisher through https://www.plasticvilleguide.com/ for the price stated above. The site also has some sample pages for viewing. I found the guide on Amazon a while back but it does not seem to be listed there at present. The prices on Amazon were higher than the website price of \$29.95.

fter Promontory: One Hundred Years of Transcontinental Railroading, edited by the Center for Railroad Photography & Art, 320 pages, hardcover, 10 ½ × 10 ½ format, \$60. Published by Indiana University Press.

As one can imagine from the listed author, the book is mostly photographs. The photographs range from very early construction photos of the Transcontinental to color photos of more modern vintage.

Four well known railroad historians provide essays as introductions to various sections of this book. They include Maury Klein, Keith L Bryant Jr., Don L Hofsommer, and Drake Hokanson. A brief biography of each contributor is included on the dust jacket. The essays are lengthy but highly informative and are interspersed with photos relative to the era being discussed by the author. There is an Early Views and Modern Views chapter immediately following each essay. The titles of these chapters include; To the Far West, To the Desert West, and to the Northwest and are nearly full page or even double page photos with excellent captions.

With all that there are also biographies of the contributing photographers and an index to their photos. There is also


es, hardcover, 11 × 9 format, \$59.95. Published by Rich Melvin, LLC. Over 200 photos mostly in color. Who better to author a book about the 765 than a person who was intimately involved with its operation for over 34 years. He was both a crew member as well as the Operations Manager for over 30 of those years. There is the usual introduction by the author but on the preceding page is an In Memoriam listing former crew members who have passed on. To me that is just plain classy.

Some of the chapters are written by others. Chapter two is 18 pages in length. It is a reprint, complete with captioned pictures, charts, and diagrams that originally appeared in the October, 1962 issue of *Trains* magazine. But I digress.

The first chapter, Evolution of the Breed, describes how the Berkshire was created in response to the need for more power than was available from the 2-8-2 "Super Mike" Mikado locomotives. The following chapters relate how the engine was rescued from an outdoor display where is was starting to seriously deteriorate. It also describes how when planning a return trip home that it is highly advisable to ensure that there is enough water in the tender. Another chapter describes how modern technology, flange greasers, caused the locomotive to continually lose speed and enter a tunnel at well below the preferred speed of 50 MPH. I will let you read the consequences of the slower speed. There are two chapters describing 765's

a short Acknowledgments/Donors page as well as a page of information regarding the Center for Railroad Photography & Art.

The dust jacket photo caught my eye and I decided that I needed to see what was inside. I am glad that I did. I hope that you will enjoy the essays, as well as the illustrated vintage photos, stereopticon slides, and postcards.



After Promontory: One Hundred Years of Transcontinental Railroading is available from the Indiana University Press at https://iupress.org/. A search using the word promontory navigated me to the book's page. The page also lists an E-book for \$49.99 in addition to the hard copy. It seems, though, that the book cannot be purchased directly from them but must be purchased through a favorite book store. The page contains links to Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Bookshop, and Books-A-Million. Amazon was the only site to offer an E-book. It lists a Kindle version for \$9.99. I also found it on Hamilton Books. Prices varied considerably across the above mentioned sites. It may take a bit of searching to find the best price.

trips on the famous Pennsylvania Horseshoe Curve. My two favorite photos in this book are in these chapters. Both photos show 765 ascending the curve. The first photo with a "just in case you need help" diesel and



the second with 765 pulling 13 passenger cars all by herself.

This is a rare book in my opinion. One can read histories of locomotives and their restorations and operations but when the author is intimately involved it just makes it so much better. I thoroughly enjoyed reading all 22 chapters. I am sure that you will also.
